ABOUT US

The Surrey Food Bank is a member of Food Banks BC and an affiliate member of Food Banks Canada.





The Surrey Food Bank is a registered charity with a vision to "Grow Our Community Beyond Hunger". Since 1983, the Surrey Food Bank has been assisting individuals and families living in Surrey and North Delta by providing nutritious food to supplement their own food purchases. All funding comes from our community as the food bank does not receive any core government funding. The combination of the staff and community contributions whether they are financial gifts, food, volunteer time, initiative or skills is powerful.

History

In 1981, in response to a downturn in the economy, a coalition of churches opened a food cupboard in Surrey. Two years later, in June 1983, the Surrey Food Bank Society was formed and opened up in a dilapidated building on King George Highway. The location and the Society itself were deemed to be temporary measures until the economy turned around and people could get back on their feet.

What began as a temporary solution to a temporary problem has grown to a 7000 square foot warehouse in Whalley, an additional 8000 square foot warehouse in Port Kells, a fleet of five vehicles, 2 lift trucks, 200 active volunteers and a core staff of sixteen. The Surrey Food Bank Society currently distributes food to approximately 1500 families each week and has expanded its reach by providing food and household items to the schools, shelters, missions and transition houses who are serving vulnerable populations.

Letter from the Executive Director

This new year brings a time of changes and possibilities for the Surrey Food Bank. It marks the 35th year since we opened our doors, and while the need for our help has not changed, the face of who uses the food bank has. We continue to see an alarming number of children and babies coming to our food bank, more and more working families, seniors who are struggling with small pensions to meet their basic needs and new immigrants and refugees who arrive in our community. The cost of food is increasing, the cost of transport and the high cost of housing means people are spending a huge percentage of their monthly income just to have a home to live in. There are thousands of people in our community still facing life's greatest challenges, and the cycle continues.

Food banks are providing essential support to so many in need. In 2017 the Surrey Food Bank provided over 52,000 hampers of food to families in Surrey and North Delta, (over 200 families each day) and tens of thousands of pounds of groceries to other agencies in the community who are helping with meal programs, community kitchens, extreme weather shelters and other food supports.

Over our 35 years we have grown as an organization, we have expanded to include 4 distribution locations around our city, we have created services to help the most vulnerable in our community; we have helped to break the cycle of poverty for many of our neighbours. But our work is not done. We are looking to expand and evolve even more as the diversity and needs of our clients continue to grow. We continue to explore new opportunities and partnerships that will facilitate connections and empower our clients. It is because of the courage and resilience of our clients and through the support, passion, hard work, compassion and generosity of our donors, volunteers and staff that we have been and continue to make a difference in our community.

Thank you for being part of the Surrey Food Bank's mission to grow our community beyond hunger for the past 35 years, and your continued support as we move into the future.

As we enter our 35TH YEAR SERVING OUR COMMUNITY, we pause to reflect on our journey and how our story has evolved from a temporary measure in the early 1980s, to one of the largest food banks in the province, serving thousands of people per month and working to provide avenues and opportunities for our neighbours to break the cycle of poverty and food insecurity. We have grown from a simple food hamper program to expanded services that address the most vulnerable in our society;

- EVENING DISTRIBUTION COMMENCED IN 2012 FOR THOSE CLIENTS WHO ARE WORKING OR GOING TO SCHOOL DURING REGULAR DISTRIBUTION HOURS
- SENIORS DISTRIBUTION, STARTED IN 2016, WORKS TO NOT ONLY PROVIDE HEALTHY FOOD TO OUR SENIORS 65+, BUT TO COMBAT ISOLATION AND BUILD CONNECTIONS FOR THOSE MOST VULNERABLE
- OUR NEW LIVING FARM WALL EMBRACES THE TECHNOLOGY TO GROW OUR OWN FRESH PRODUCE TO PROVIDE OUR CLIENTS WITH MORE HEALTHY OPTIONS
- STARTED IN 2017, THE FAMILY PLAY CAFÉ BRINGS TOGETHER
 FAMILIES AND YOUNG CHILDREN FROM DIVERSE GROUPS AND
 BACKGROUNDS TO PLAY, CONNECT, AND LEARN ABOUT FOOD AND
 LITERACY AND CREATE NEW LASTING MEMORIES AND FRIENDSHIPS

While we have many things to celebrate and be grateful for, we continue to face challenges in our search for a new building, a facility where we can expand further to accommodate the growing diversity and needs of our clients. Working with partners and supporters, this has been a labour of love as well as frustration. We have been searching for a long time and are now exploring a solution with a light at the end of the tunnel. 



